

DER-STD-20-011_13 Undertaking CoC Evaluations Remotely in the Middle East

Rationale	On 10 March 2026, FSC published DER-STD-20-011_05, permitting certain chain of custody (CoC) evaluations to be conducted remotely in the Middle East. The rationale was that military strikes had occurred in the region, and there was a risk of ongoing reprisal attacks, escalation across the region, and deterioration of local security situations. This affected the ability of auditors to travel to the affected geographical areas to perform physical inspections of sites. DER-STD-20-011_05 was valid until 10 September 2026. However, high-level travel restrictions continue to apply to the geographic areas listed below. International SOS advises deferring all inbound travel to some areas, and only conducting business-critical travel to others. Accordingly, FSC has decided to grant this new Derogation (DER-STD-20-011_13), valid until 31 December 2026, on the same terms as the previous derogation (see terms outlined in 'FSC Conclusion' and Annex A below).
FSC Conclusion	FSC grants the request for remote audits to replace on-site surveillance evaluations (for all applicants) and re-evaluation assessments (for low-risk applicants) in the following list of geographical areas: • Bahrain • Iran • Iraq • Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territories, including the West Bank and the Gaza Strip • Jordan • Kuwait • Lebanon • North Sinai • Oman • Palestinian Territories • Qatar

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- Saudi Arabia
 - South Sinai
 - Syria
 - United Arab Emirates
 - Yemen

This derogation shall only apply to surveillance evaluations (for all applicants) and re-evaluation assessments (for low-risk applicants) to be conducted for certificate holders with operational sites located in the above list of geographical areas.

This derogation is not applicable to main evaluations.

Preconditions for Re-evaluation Assessments

For applicants with 'low' risk (see Annex A), the certification body (CB) shall undertake the re-evaluation assessment as a remote audit.

The CB shall conduct a risk assessment for each applicant according to the scenarios/factors provided in **Annex A** to determine the option of conducting remote audits for re-evaluation assessments.

The risk assessment is to be undertaken at the level of a single site and not at the certificate level. For multi-site certificates, the risk assessment shall be undertaken for each participating site (or for each site selected by sampling) prior to the re-evaluation assessment audit.

When an applicant falls into more than one risk category, the CB shall adopt the precautionary approach and apply the higher risk category.

For applicants that would be considered 'medium' or 'high' risk (see Annex A), CBs shall provide additional requested information to FSC for a separate derogation to be considered for re-evaluation assessments on a case-by-case basis.

The additional information to be provided to FSC for assessment should include, but is not limited to:

- Certificate scope
 - FSC product groups;
 - FSC sales (Annual Volume Summary);
 - FSC stock on-site.

****Normal risk participating site:** A participating site that does not conduct any of the activities considered 'high risk' above.
